

## ELIGIBILITY

Home and Community Based Services for persons living with Brain Injury (HCBS-BI) is a Medicaid program that provides funding for extensive treatment for those who meet the financial qualifications to access the program.

To qualify medically, applicants must have a primary diagnosis of brain injury resulting in residual, physical, cognitive or emotional difficulties. Stroke and various other diagnoses may qualify as brain injury.

Application for the HCBS-BI Waiver must be made during the initial admission or readmission to an acute care or rehabilitation hospital or unit. Application for the Supported Living Program (SLP) must be made through the Single Entry Point Agency in the individual's county of residence.

Financial application can be made by going to the Department of Human Services at 105 N. Spruce in Colorado Springs if you reside in El Paso County or 740 Hwy 24 in Woodland Park for residents of Teller County. If you reside outside of these counties, please contact the Department of Human Services in your county of residence.

In addition to Medicaid, we also accept private fee for service or other insurance that has agreed to pay for services.

Rocky Mountain Brain Injury Services is dedicated to helping these individuals reach the highest level of independence possible. We offer a full continuum of care to insure the greatest possibility of success for each individual.

## RESIDENTIAL

Nestled in neighborhoods within Colorado Springs', our three, 8-bed residential homes—Columbine, Spruce and Soaring—provide comfortable and adaptive living environments. For individuals who require a higher level of physical assistance or require daily nursing care, we offer The Lodge—a 28-bed, one level facility with highly qualified LPN and RN staff to meet these needs. Our facilities are staffed 24-hours a day by Independent Living Skills Trainers and Brain Injury Technicians who assist residents with activities of living while teaching independent living skills and community reintegration.



The on-staff nurse practitioner works closely with primary and specialty care physicians in the community, providing advanced nursing and medical oversight for all of our clients. This allows us to provide a preventative, quality medical model of care in the post-acute and supportive living environment.

Our residential program includes a challenging activity program that provides each individual physical, social and mental stimulation. When an individual is ready, he or she is given the opportunity to pursue occupational opportunities in the workforce.



## DAY PROGRAM

Our Day Clinic offers a community support center where participants can work on living skills and enjoy social interaction activities. Services offered at the clinic include (But are not limited to) sensory-motor development, community reintegration skills training, professional mental health services, cognitive training, medication monitoring and vocational skills training.



## COUNSELING SERVICES

For individuals who have suffered a brain injury, their lives are dramatically altered literally overnight. Many of our clients have benefitted from Individual and/or Group Counseling services to help in coping with grief, depression, anxiety, isolation and other emotional issues that were a result of their injury and its' effects. Some clients may have mental health issues prior to their brain injury and these issues don't disappear but are often exacerbated by the injury. Our professional counselors treat substance abuse, major mental illness, personality disorders and more. We have counselors trained in Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT), Eye Movement Desensitization Reprocessing (EMDR) as well as other therapeutic approaches.
