Intake Screening and Referral

Our case managers conduct a preliminary telephone screening of each individual's need for long-term care services, eligibility for financial assistance, and the need for a comprehensive long-term care assessment.

Home and Community-Based Services

Rocky Mountain Options for Long-Term Care or RMOLTC provides case management and assessment for Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) to the elderly, blind and physically disabled; to persons with mental illness; to individuals with brain injury and; to persons living with AIDS. We help these individuals find services that can be received at home or in the community rather than in an institutional setting.

The purpose of this program is to offer participants an intensive, cost-effective home based alternative to institutionalization.

Case managers refer, coordinate, and pre-authorize services such as electronic monitoring, personal care, adult day care, homemaking and alternative care facility placement.

***Please Note:** Although the above services are approved to be part of the HCBS program, not all services may be offered by providers in this community.

Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE)

PACE is a program that utilizes the blending of Medicare and Medicaid to optimize the services an individual will receive. This unique program offers complete professional and medical care to individuals with multiple medical needs.

A highly trained team, including physicians and other professional disciplines, skillfully direct all care provided to an individual. This team follows the daily needs of individuals at home or in more serious situations that may require hospitalization. The team continuity and oversight flows with the individual at the hospital, home, and all settings to assure the highest quality of care is always provided.

Consumer Directed Attendant Support

This new federal program enables qualified individual to manage their own attendant services. They can hire, train, supervise, and dismiss their own attendants. They can set their own attendants' schedule and, to a significant degree, determine what services their attendants provide.

The goal of this program is to give participants more independence and give greater control back to the participant.

Community to Nursing Home Placements

RMOLTC case managers will assess any person living in the community who is on Medicaid and requesting nursing home placement. This assessment determines the appropriateness of nursing home level of care.

Pediatric Hospice Waiver (Hopeful Waiver)

For children from birth to 19 years of age that have a life limiting illness that in medical professional opinion has a prognosis of death that is highly probable before the child reaches adulthood.

Eligible recipients can already be receiving Medicaid benefits through SSI or if not, will need to apply for Long Term Care Medicaid through the Department of Human Services. For those who do not already have SSI, family will need to apply through the Social Security Administration. If the child is denied SSI, the Department of Human Services must have a copy of the denial letter for the Long Term Care process.

In-Home Support Services

In-Home Support Services is a new HCBS program that allows eligible Medicaid clients to select and direct their own care with the assistance of one of our case managers. The program will provide health maintenance activities, personal care, activities of daily living and homemaker services.
